### This is a Matters of Importance I gave in church several years ago...the need is ever greater now!

Imagine a couple of scenarios with me:

First, you and your family are traveling over summer break. Where you are headed, there is not a church nearby to attend on Sunday, but there is Wi-Fi. Luckily, shortly after the 9:30am service most weeks, you can go to our website and click on the "Service Video" link, and you will be directed to a video of St. John's entire service for that day. In the very least, you will have a chance to hear God's Word and to stay attuned to what is happening at your church. While not the same as being there, it is at least something in an area where there is not a chance to get to a church.

Scenario number two: Imagine that you came to church one week and were struck by the music or readings or hymns or the sermon. By the time you get home, you aren't quite sure you remember exactly what it was that was so moving. By going to our website, you get a chance to revisit that moment, and to bring to your remembrance the tune or word that spoke to you, and you find yourself edified in the week ahead.

Scenario number three: You are sick and you had to miss church, but upon your recovery, you run into a fellow St. John's member at the grocery store who mentions that you were missed, and that by the way, Pastor Noack gave one of the greatest sermons he has ever preached (hey, it could happen!). Upset that you missed, and cursing your illness, you suddenly remember, "Hey, I can just go on the web and see what was so great about this sermon!"

Scenario number four: Bill and Suzy Thompson move to Sayville from the great state of Iowa. They are life-long Lutherans, but are unsure what a saltwater Lutheran church might be like. So they jump on the web and to their surprise, there is a Lutheran church right in Sayville. Curious as to what to expect when they get there, they happen upon the Service Video link and watch one of our services. "It is just like our church in Iowa," Suzy says. Bill and Suzy come, and after just a few weeks, they decide to make St. John's their new church home. Had it not been for seeing a service, they may not have tried us out.

These are just a few of the reasons that the Video Ministry is such a vital part of our work here at St. John's. Each week, our 9:30am service is recorded and is available for viewing by the worldwide public. Our dedicated team of people work behind the scenes up in the balcony, often unnoticed, to make sure that what we produce online is a quality product and thus make it another avenue for getting the Gospel message out to a wider audience.

The Video Ministry team could use some more help, however. Currently, just two people do this week after week, and if one of them goes on vacation or gets sick, it is hard to make sure everything is covered. With a bigger group, we could ensure that all our services are recorded and uploaded to the web each week, and spread the work out amongst more folks. The time commitment is minimal, not much longer than attending

the regular service itself. You come a little early to make sure everything is set with the computers and equipment, and then stay a little after the service to give the video to Pastor for uploading to the website. The equipment is fairly modern, but not complicated, and once you get the hang of it, it is quite a bit of fun to do.

Please prayerfully consider becoming a part of this great work. If you might be interested, or if you have questions, please speak to Pastor, or to Bill Kopf who currently heads this ministry for us. Training will be provided and you would be doing a big service to Christ, to St. John's, and to the Church at large. This is also a great way to get youth involved: come to church and play with technology – what could be much better than that! Young or old, and anything in between, we could use your help! Please prayerfully consider it!

Beginning here we glimpse the Three-in-one;
The river runs, the clouds are torn apart,
The Father speaks, the Spirit and the Son

And calls and keeps and kindles us to light.
The dove descends, the spirit soars and sings
"You are beloved, you are my delight!"
In that quick light and life, as water spills

The river; the washing. Here is Christ Incarnate entering our world, baptized in the Jordan River as Father and Spirit make known their presence. It recalls our baptismal liturgy as God "condemned the unbelieving world through the flood, but preserved believing Noah and his family"; it harkens back to deliverance of the Israelites passing through the Red Sea with their enemies drowned behind them, and their passing over the Jordan River stepping into the promised land. It brings to mind Naaman's cleansing from leprosy after swallowing pride and washing in the Jordan seven times, as instructed by Elisha, and Philip's dialogue with the Ethiopian Eunuch, explaining the scriptures and leading to the Eunuch's desire for baptism in the waters by which they were passing.

In the baptismal liturgy we pray that "through this saving flood all sin in us, which has been inherited from Adam and which we have committed since, would be drowned and die;... that we would be kept safe and secure in the holy ark of the Christian Church ... serving [God's] name at all times with a fervent spirit and a joyful hope."

Having just relived Christ's passion and re-read those Old Testament stories of promise and deliverance and having experienced Christ's victory over sin and the grave for us through his death and resurrection and having renewed our own baptismal vows at the Easter Vigil, now is the time to live with and in him, by His Spirit.

The Alleluias of Easter are exhilarating. May the Spirit "soar and sing" in us in every part of our lives as


