

As We Gather

It is a glorious vision that Peter, James, and John are privy to today. It is a picture of Jesus in his glorified state, and a picture of Jesus as the fulfiller of all the Law and the Prophets, made clear by the presence of Moses and Elijah. The purpose of this vision is to remind these three disciples of what the end result is, for Jesus will descend the mountain to make his way to the cross, and that will be a hard thing for the disciples to watch and endure. But glory waits on the other side, and the promise to us today is that this is also true for us. We, with Jesus, pass through death into the glories he has prepared for us in his kingdom as we join the saints in dwelling in Christ's glorious light forever.

Today in the Church Year

Epiphany serves as the end of the Christmas season, bridging us over from Christ's birth to the beginning of his life and ministry. On the day of Epiphany, Christ is revealed as the savior of the world. Next, we see his divinity confirmed as the Father speaks and the Spirit descends in the waters of the Jordan at his baptism. Then he will call his disciples and will perform miracles. And finally, as the hinge that leads us into the holy season of Lent, our Lord will be transfigured into a vision of light as he prepares to set his face toward Jerusalem to accomplish the salvation of the world. The season of Epiphany prepares us for this salvation, and serves to reveal the mystery of Christ's identity and his work to us. The initial color for the season is white, but yields to green to symbolize the light of Christ revealed through the growth accomplished by his word. Transfiguration Sunday will again be white to show forth the purity and holiness of the God-Man, Jesus.

Exodus 24:8-18

- L** The Old Testament Reading for The Transfiguration of our Lord is taken from Exodus, the twenty-fourth chapter.

8 And Moses took the blood and threw it on the people and said, “Behold the blood of the covenant that the Lord has made with you in accordance with all these words.”

9 Then Moses and Aaron, Nadab, and Abihu, and seventy of the elders of Israel went up, 10 and they saw the God of Israel. There was under his feet as it were a pavement of sapphire stone, like the very heaven for clearness. 11 And he did not lay his hand on the chief men of the people of Israel; they beheld God, and ate and drank. 12 The Lord said to Moses, “Come up to me on the mountain and wait there, that I may give you the tablets of stone, with the law and the commandment, which I have written for their instruction.” 13 So Moses rose with his assistant Joshua, and Moses went up into the mountain of God. 14 And he said to the elders, “Wait here for us until we return to you. And behold, Aaron and Hur are with you. Whoever has a dispute, let him go to them.”

15 Then Moses went up on the mountain, and the cloud covered the mountain.

16 The glory of the Lord dwelt on Mount Sinai, and the cloud covered it six days. And on the seventh day he called to Moses out of the midst of the cloud. 17 Now the appearance of the glory of the Lord was like a devouring fire on the top of the mountain in the sight of the people of Israel. 18 Moses entered the cloud and went up on the mountain. And Moses was on the mountain forty days and forty nights.
